Wintering and refit

Around the Bassins à flot ship repair hub, Bordeaux Port offers a secure area in the heart of the city for the wintering of your ship, close to restaurants, bars, cinemas, hotels, etc. and close to the main road axes.

In Bassens or Bacalan, Bordeaux Port also offers excellent safety and protection conditions for equipment, for all types of maintenance operations (mechanical, electrical or boiler work, fairing, etc.) with all the amenities needed (security, supplies, water, electricity, etc.).

Bordeaux Port can accommodate refit activities within a modernized ship repair hub adapted to the needs of companies, with

- > The Bassens drydock (drydock 3) 240 X 35 m
- > The Bacalan slipway (wich can accommodate 5 vessels at the same time, with maximum dimensions of 60 m long)
- > The Bacalan drydock 1: 150 x 22 m
- > The Bacalan drydock 2: 100 x 17 m

The Dordogne river flows from the east, passing through Libourne (St-Emilion), and joins the Garonne. The combined river then flows north through Bourg-sur-Gironde, Blaye, Cussac-Fort-Médoc, and Pauillac, eventually reaching the Gironde estuary. Royan is located on the northern shore of the estuary. Bordeaux, the world's capital of wine, is as captivating as dynamic. The city boasts unique architectural heritage that has earned it UNESCO listing under the name "The Port of the Moon". Bordeaux charms visitors with spectacular views of its redesigned quaysides, sumptuous 18th century facades and landmarks such as the Water Mirror, Place de la Bourse, and Place des Quinconces. A visit to Bordeaux is also the perfect opportunity to discover the Triangle d'Or district, the Cité du Vin, and new trendy places with a strong port identity such as the Bassins à Flot (Wet Docks).



Paillac lies mid-way between Bordeaux and the ocean and is home to some of France's most 'haute-couture' wines. Paillac is renowned worldwide for its prestigious Grands Crus Classés such as Margaux, Mouton-Rothschild, Lafite-Rothschild, and Latour. Paillac is also the perfect call for those in search of unspoilt nature, marked only by the rhythm of the tides and the graceful silhouettes of the fishing huts of Beychevelle and Saint Julien.



Royan is the proud capital of the Côte de Beauté. It is situated across from Le Verdon-Sur-Mer on the opposite bank of the Gironde, looking out to the Atlantic Ocean. A seaside resort that offers a varied atmosphere, Royan is a town of art and history that was completely rebuilt in the 1950s following the bombings of the Second World War. Royan's surroundings offer remarkable, unspoilt natural landscapes, beaches that are ideal for walking or bathing, and a wealth of flora and fauna to be discovered on a bicycle tour or a day out at La Palmyre Zoo, one of the most famous zoological park in Europe.



Blaye lies north of Bordeaux along the Gironde Estuary. It offers rare landscapes combining river, stone and vine. From the must-see, UNESCO-listed Citadelle de Vauban to the prehistoric caves of Pair-Non-Pair, Blaye and its surroundings offer architectural treasures, and wine-growing estates that are best discovered during a tasting session!



The site of Fort Médoc lies on the left bank of the Gironde Estuary. Construction began in 1689, under the reign of Louis XIV, and it is one of the three components of Vauban's "Bolt of the Estuary" defence system, together with the Citadel of Blaye and Fort Pâté. The three sites have been on UNESCO's World Heritage List since 2008.

Perched on the banks of the Dordogne, this singularly charming medieval town holds a special allure for those in search of rest and a change of scenery. Home to such varied treasures as the Château de la Citadelle, the Villa Mauresque, 18th century stone houses and a river port, Bourg-sur-Gironde also offers breath-taking views of the Gironde Estuary.



Libourne is a port town at the confluence of the Dordogne and Isle rivers. It boasts a unique cultural heritage, including the 13th century English fortified town, quaysides and a famous market. This charming call amid world-renowned wine appellations (Pomerol, Saint-Émilion, Fronsac) and estates (Angélus, Pavie, Ausone and Cheval Blanc) is just ten minutes from the UNESCO-listed medieval town of Saint-Émilion.



The 13th century fortified town of Cadillac stands on the right bank of the Garonne. It is the gateway to the Entre-deux-Mers, Sauternes and Graves vineyards. A region commonly referred to as the «Tuscany of Gironde». This unique area combines nature, history and gastronomy. With oyster caves, gallo roman villas, medieval cities, fortresses and vineyards producing wines with delicate, pale gold hues, an entire country awaits discovery here at the foot of the Gironde moors.
